#### General Meeting Synopsis December 2019

Presidents Report Jill reviewed the activities of the past year: Over the past year the club has sponsored the following activities for members: a dinner for members at the Breed Show in March; Easter Egg Hunt and Introduction to Water Work in April; Water Camp in Seneca SC in May; ACT I and ACT II in May; Pets for Vets and Southern Splash Water Trial in July, and Trophy Gifts to the National Specialty and obedience Trial in September. Jill challenged the incoming President, Maggie Martin, and Board to "do the right thing" to encourage and build volunteerism among the general membership and keep the ball rolling for the coming year. Maggie Martin – New President assumes responsibilities and she looks forward to help from everyone as we do this together. Her first act as President is thank Jill for her contributions as president and other ways over many, many, years.

Treasurer's Report – Mary Ellen WalkamaThe financials have not been updated since the meeting of November 18, 2019. At that time the P&L balance was \$~6000 but there were outstanding income and expense items that may change that number somewhat. Proceeds from the Jamboree were \$5,000. There is \$33,000 in Money Market and \$13,000 in the checking account. A formal report is forthcoming in the New Year. The budget for 2020 has not been created yet but Mary Ellen reports that it will be very similar to the budget for 2019.

The Water Trial Committee has not met. Maggie announced that the only committed judge at this point is Frank Cardillino. Cristi Wetherholt is continuing to search for judges but no news at present. Louise Mowbray will step up to replace Pam Fowler as chair of the WT Host Committee. There ensued a discussion of the difference between the Water Trial Committee and the Water Trial Host Committee. Jill clarified that the Water Trial Host Committee is the appropriate term to prevent conflict with the National Water Trial Committee. Current members remaining on the committee are Louise Mowbray, Committee Chair, Cristi Wetherholt, Trial Chair, Colleen LeMasters, Trial Secretary, Janice Reilly, Robin Illchuk, and Marcia Bingham. Karen Latham also volunteered to help if needed.

Maggie asked for new members to join the committee to learn about the water trial management and will check to see if Marlene Nicewander and Kara Kolster are remaining on the committee.

Sunshine – Connie Rego Connie noted that some members do not want their personal or health status shared with the club. Connie asked for suggestions from Board members regarding her role and what report we would like to see. Members volunteered that they appreciated her efforts and asked that she continue to do what she has been doing.

Old Business 2019 July Water Trial – Cristi Wetherholt/Kara Kolster No official report. From a financial perspective we came out ahead net \$1500.00

PWD Jamboree – Marlene Nicewander No official report - Jamboree was a huge success and a job well done.

National Basket Raffle Item – Sandy Foster Linda Fowler reported that she and Sandy Foster saw the Obedience basket put together by Jill Flebotte and Martha Ruskai at the National Specialty. It was very lovely and very well done, was very desirable and a little different.

I got my first Portuguese Water Dog, Beau, in 1991. There were only two litters on the ground at that time in the entire country. The drive Long Island from Virginia was a long one, but it beat the trip to Colorado!

I grew up with an amazing Standard Poodle who owned the neighborhood, was a superb athlete, and an ideal family dog. He pulled us on the ice in the winter, swam with us in the summer, and trained effortlessly. I have owned Irish Setters, and a Great Dane since, but was still looking for that intelligent swimmer and athlete who would fit my lifestyle. Beau was all that and more. I didn't have access to other people who were doing water work, but we did our own version in the Chesapeake Bay and the James River in Virginia. He caught fish and Frisbees in mid-air. He got his CDX in obedience and was working on his Utility title when we moved NC. He was devoted companion and finished his conformation championship with Michael Scott in 5 shows, and 4 majors. I have not had, nor wanted, any other breed of dog since.

I met Jill Flebotte at the Birdie Boutique in Durham, NC when Beau was 14 years old. We were introduced by a mutual friend, who thought it curious that we both had PWDs and African Grey Parrots, but did not know one another. We came out to her pond and a still eager Beau learned the routines fast. She was also expecting a litter of puppies and was looking for some help with whelping. I was eager to be part of it as I was considering a new puppy with my aging boy beginning to slow down.

I came over to her house after work in the evenings for a week around the due date, but the one night I couldn't come, Diva delivered. My Oscar came from that wonderful litter and showed me all that these dogs can do. He excelled in everything we tried, but loved best water and Frisbee. He took his turn in the show ring and also became a champion.

Betsy came along to join him when he was three and taught me anew the many talents of this breed, including being a fabulous therapy dog, and whelping a litter of ten in 90 minutes! Her puppies thrived and continue to delight their owners.

I now have Oscar and Betsy's son Rhett who is an old soul and has the best temperament of any dog I have ever owned. He got his championship in the show ring out of Bred by Exhibitor, has two legs toward his Masters in water, and is working on his novice CD. He is also an excellent therapy dog like his mother, and is allowed to come to work with me in this capacity.

I am a Pediatrician in a rural Federally Qualified Health Center, which provides care to the medically underserved. I am grateful that my love of dogs informs my care of children and vice versa. I hope to bring this love of the breed and their many talents to my role as president of The Movers and Shakers Portuguese Water Dog Club of the Carolinas. I am a consensus builder by nature and look forward to hearing from club members on ways to improve our stewardship of this wonderful breed of dogs.



My love affair with PWDs began in 1999 with Joker, a five-year old whose owner could no longer care for him. He came to me on American Airlines and lived with me for 8 years before he suddenly died of what we thought was hemangiosarcoma. Since then there have been 4 other PWDs in the lives of myself and my husband, Pete. We currently have two PWDs, having recently lost our 13 year-old rescued PWD, Walker. We live in Beaufort NC and participate in Water and Agility. Pete and I have belonged to Movers & Shakers for 10 years and during that time I have served as web diva for the Club's website. I have served as the Regional Rescue Representative for the Movers and Shakers PWD Club of the Carolinas since 2012. I also serve as Secretary on the Board of PWDCA Rescue. When not working with our PWDS, I fly a 1946 Aeronca Champ for fun and relaxation, or when the weather is not good, dabble in fiber arts. I am just now learning how to spin wool for yarn.

My journey with Portuguese Water Dogs began when our first Portuguese Water Dog, Rio, joined our family 18 years ago.

My first water camp experience was a cold, rainy, weekend spent with four wet dogs and a wet wife in a tent in Al-

berta, Canada. The fun part was watching PWDs do what they were bred to do. The next year, after a water camp affectionately named "mud camp", the instructor (and water judge) convinced my wife Robin and I to make the 800-mile (one-way) trek to the closest trial in Seattle, WA. Even though we had never even seen a trial in person, Rio obtained his AWD and WWD that weekend, and I was hooked.

Robin and I have been blessed with some great dogs, all with different personalities and learning styles. Rio, the pleaser (CWDX and GROM), Luna, the bossy bitch (CWDX and GROM) and Gracie, the beautiful couch potato wanna-be (WWD and SROM) have made the journey across the Rainbow Bridge and are swimming in warm water now. Hollywood, the social butterfly (WWD and GROM), Aryanna, the elegant snuggler (AWD), Tique, the loud mouth (JWC) Sparkle, the new wild child, are actively competing in water, obedience, agility, rally and conformation.

I became a PWDCA Water Judge in 2016. In 2018 Robin and I relocated to Columbia, SC, to be where the ice isn't on the lake 8 months of the year. We breed a very limited number of litters under Whoosh Portuguese Water Dogs and enjoy helping owners start on their own PWD journeys.



I am originally from PA and bred and exhibited Old English Sheepdogs at that time. In the late 1980s I moved to Chesapeake, Virginia and lost my last beloved Old English Sheepdog. I decided to think about which breed would be a better fit for the hot humid summers plus my love for the water. I was already a member of an all breed club and while attending one of their shows saw my first Portuguese Water Dog. After researching the breed and visiting a local breeder, **I was hooked**.

My first Portuguese Water Dog came to live with me in 1996. I went back to showing and breeding on a very

limited basis producing numerous titled dogs. A friend encouraged me to enter the first Movers and Shakers water trial. I did not know a thing about water trials back then but took my four dogs to the trials that weekend. The dogs all got junior titles and I was thrilled.

There were a few more things I wanted to accomplish on my bucket list and one was to finish my dog from the bred by exhibitor class, which I did. When



AKC introduced the grand championship title, I decided to get a GCH on my six year old dog. Not planning to rank him, but after winning a couple of supported entries I was pulled into the ranking game. He made it into the top ten Portuguese Water dogs for that year.

Now, after 22 years of being involved with this breed, I am still doing water trials, conformation, obedience, barn hunt along with beginning agility.

I was always a member of the PWDCA and remain a member of my all breed club in Virginia. I served as President for over 5 years, Show Chair, along with serving as Corresponding Secretary, Judge's Selection committee, member of the board and held various other positions as well. One of the many journeys in my life led me to dogs and the sport of obedience with my miniature schnauzers. We had lots of fun with competition. My first Portuguese Water Dog would have been about 16, he is the one in the picture. I came to a Movers and Shakers Water Trial to learn about Water Work

My love for dogs started out at an early age. When I was 13 years old, I was finally old enough volunteer at my local animal shelter. I volunteered most weekends and every summer up until I went to college. I would often get to foster orphaned kittens and puppies. During that time, I had a Border Collie named Andre. He was a typical farm bred (not well bred) Border Collie, full of energy and very biddable. I used him for all my 4H projects from 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Grade. Cristi Wetherholt invited us up to her pond to start training water work. With the help of Cindi Robusto and Cristi, Aidan became quite the water dog. While spending time together, I got to help them train Indy and Sammie for water trials. This is when I fell in love with PWDs and Water Work. In 2012, I welcomed my first PWD into my little family. Armada is my first PWD, so I'm not as well versed in the breed as most. After Aidan's untimely death from hemangiosarcoma in October 2015, Trek decided that Jeremy (my boyfriend) was Trek's, so Trek ended up staying with us. Armada has decided that he does not like water, which is fine with me, but he currently has 19 AKC titles (none of which are overly impressive) and is the most amazing therapy dog. Since we did not get Trek until he was 18 months old, he was a bit behind in his foundations, so he has been a bit slower in earning titles. Trek currently has 10 AKC titles and 2 PWDCA titles. In January 2020, I will be going back to my "bull breed" roots and will be welcoming a Staffordshire Bull Terrier puppy into the pack.
